GENERAL SUMMARY:

Reporting to the Executive Director/Chief Executive Officer, the Director of Legal and Regulatory Affairs will be responsible for supporting the Executive Director's and the Board of Director's goals and initiatives by providing legal advice on business issues and agency strategies. The Director of Legal and Regulatory Affairs must possess the ability to handle confidential matters with discretion, integrity, ethics, and business acumen.

Responsibilities include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Manage the work of outside counsel, including contracts, maritime, and labor and employment.
- Develop in-depth understanding of relevant legislative and regulatory processes, as well as roles and decision-making processes of key governmental and regulatory agencies.
- Monitor, analyze, and implement federal and state legislation, regulations and political activity relating to issues that may impact the SJPC.
- Act as liaison with federal and state agencies whose jurisdiction includes regulation or oversight of areas affecting the SJPC and effectively work with key players in relevant government departments and agencies.
- > Review and provide input into the preparation of complex commercial and other agreements.
- ➤ Identify issues of interest and develop strategies to address them consistent with business objectives.
- Ensure the SJPC operates in compliance with all applicable laws and regulations.
- > Draft memoranda and reports related to legislative strategies.
- Research applicable federal and state grants. Provide guidance and assist with the application process.
- Manage the Open Public Records Act (OPRA) program.

Gain transportation and maritime industry subject-matter proficiency to gather and share information internally and externally; and work with various organizations, including trade associations, industry organizations, and public interest groups.
